- Teachers have increased knowledge of children's social and emotional development and skills to address challenging behaviors



Young Child Institute







Young Child Institute serves children birth to five years of age. Our mission is to enhance the social and emotional development of young children by supporting their relationship with their primary caregivers.

We provide diagnostic evaluations and treatment services to children birth to 5 and their families. Our qualified staff provide clinical services in a home-like setting at our main location and prevention services in childcare centers and preschools.

Our multidisciplinary staff includes child psychiatrists, child psychologists, clinical social workers, clinical counselors, and child case managers.



Clinical Services

- Support parents and caregivers in creating a healthy relationship with their child
- Educate parents and caregivers about social and emotional development
- Provide a strength-based approach to managing challenging behavior
- Assist parents with various behavioral challenges such as temper tantrums, aggression, anxiety, hyperactivity, and eating/sleeping problems
- Consult and collaborate with childcare professionals, Hamilton County Job and Family Services, the court system, pediatricians, and other treatment providers
- Provide services to Spanish speaking children and families

Provided Services Include:

- Clinical Assessment
- Psychological Evaluation
- Parent/Child Therapy
- Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT)
- Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR)
- Play Therapy
- Trauma Informed Therapy

- Nurturing Touch Consultation
- Medication Consultation
- Case management

Prevention Services

Childreach

- Serves child care centers and preschools through out Hamilton County
- Consults with child care professionals and parents who need help managing children's challenging behavior and emotional struggles
- Helps child care professionals create classroom environments that support children's social and emotional development
- Supports teachers in building children's resiliency using the strength-based Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA)
- Refers children to more intensive treatment services, as necessary

Professional Services

- Provides training and clinical placement for graduate students in counseling and social work
- Provides clinical consultation and training to community professionals who are working with children aged birth to five
